
English Program In Korea

To whom it may concern

I recommend Ihn Joon Song for the English Program In Korea (EPIK) . Ihn Joon was a student here at California State University, Northridge (CSUN ) between the fall semester of 1993 and 1998. He maintained good standing in all semesters. Prior to enrolling at CSUN Ihn Joon completed an associate degree by taking classes at Los Angeles Pierce, Valley, and Mission Junior Colleges. I did not have Ihn Joon in any of my classes because I did not arrive at CSUN until after he graduated in 1998. However I have talked with some of his former professors and all had positive things to say. I note that he maintained a satisfactory record, did not fail or repeat classes, and passed through the program with relative ease. In terms of scholarship I would rank him among the top 35% of all the students at the CSUN, no small distinction given the high caliber of our students and the fact that Ihn Joon is not a native English speaker.
